


Scarves for the RAF Veterans



Scarf on the left is for a man and is plain, the other for a lady. I don't have specific pattern, but I am told the length is 170cm or a little less. If you look carefully they are knitted width ways in garter stitch. 20 sts is 10cm and they will stretch, so I estimate 300sts. You will need a circular needle used flat for this.

They should be done in red, white and blue, I don't think the shade of blue is too important, but not light blue. The darker blue is hard to see but looking at the white and the red, they are 10 rows each, so I would guess the blue is 12 rows. I don't think it really matters too much.

The ladies scarf I think is 16 blue rows and 24 white. The red heart is knitted separately and sewn on and fringes added.

Knitted heart

Cast on 3sts (DK on 4mm)

K 2 rows

K1, K front and back in next two sts. (5sts)

K row

K1, Kfb in next st, K1 Kfb, K1

K row

Continue increasing by Kfb into second st and penultimate st on every RS row till you have 21sts.

K 3 rows.

Next row RS, K10 cast off 1, K9 (20sts with a CO in the middle)

K10 turn

K1, sl1, k1, pss0, k4, k2tog, k1 (8sts)

WS row- knit

K1, sl1, k1, pss0, k2, k2tog, k1 (6sts)

WS row- knit

K1, sl1, k1, pss0, k2 tog, k1 (4 sts)

WS row – knit

Cast off. Break yarn, rejoin to the other side and repeat shaping.
