

Lacy Triangular Shawl

For patients at the NNU Hospital

Abbreviations: ch chain; ch-lp chain loop; dc double crochet; rep repeat; sp space; ss slip stitch; st(s) stitch(es); tr treble.

Size : Approximately 130cm x 100cm

This shawl can be made in any DK yarn, but the Wool Loft acrylic yarn is good.

You will need one 200g ball of varicolour yarn or two 100g balls , any colour.

Have fun trying different yarns, but the size may vary.

Using a 4.5mm crochet hook (UK 7) make a ch of 175 sts.

1st row Miss first ch, dc in each ch to end, 174 sts, turn.

2nd row *6ch, miss 2 dc, dc in next dc; rep from * to end, turn.

3rd and every following row Ss in first 3ch, *6ch, dc in next 6ch-lp; rep from * to end, turn.

Rep last row until left with one 6ch-lp. Fasten off, weave in ends.

Picot edging is used to finish the top of the shawl.

Working along top of shawl, attach yarn at one end, 1ch, dc in same st,

*** 4ch, ss in 4th ch from hook, dc in each of next 2 sts; rep from* across top edge, ending [4ch, ss in 4th ch from hook, dc] all in last st.**

Leave yarn attached.

Side shell edging worked around the two remaining sides.

Into next 6ch-sp work * dc, 4tr, dc ; rep from * around the two unedged sides.

working dc, 9tr, dc; in lp at bottom point. Fasten off and weave in ends.

The shawl curls naturally around the neck and will stay put on the shoulders.
