

Scout and Cub Teddy



DK Yarn. Black for trousers, blue for Scouts or green for Cubs. beige for paws and head. Grey for belt.

Size 10 or 3 ¾ mm needles

Cast on 10 sts with beige and knit 10 rows.

Change to black and knit 30 rows.

Repeat to make 2nd leg (I knit both legs at the same time, working from the middle and end of the ball)

Work across all 20 sts, and knit 12 rows.

Change to grey and knit 4 rows.

Change to blue or green and knit 24 rows.

Change to beige and working in st. st. work 6½", (about 46 rows)

Change to blue or green and work 24 rows

Change to grey and knit 4 rows

Change to black and knit 12 rows

Continue in black and work each leg either separately or at the same time.

Knit 30 rows on each leg.

Knit 10 rows in beige and cast off.

Arms:

Pick up 8 sts either side of shoulder and knit 20 rows.

Change to beige and knit 10 rows.

Cut yarn and thread through sts and pull tight.

Sew a running thread around base of head.

Sew up all seams leaving a gap for stuffing. Stuff well and sew up gap.

Sew across corners of head for ears.

Pull up thread around neck and sew in ends. Embroider a square in middle of the belt for a buckle. Sew on a happy face.

Scarf: I used a triangle of lining material to make a scarf or knit or crochet a piece with a triangle hanging on the back. A small amount of yarn can be twisted and sewn round ends of scarf for a woggle.
